



First-Generation College Celebration Day: A Planning Resource

<u>First-Generation College Celebration Day</u>, held annually on November 8th, was created by the <u>Council for</u> <u>Opportunity in Education</u> (COE) and the <u>Center for First-generation Student Success</u> in 2017 to encourage colleges, universities, corporations, non-profits, and K-12 schools to recognize, honor, and celebrate the representation and success of first-generation college students, faculty, staff, and alumni. This day has steadily grown to a week-long celebration featuring at many campuses, workshops, speakers, social media campaigns, and other activities to highlight the first-generation community and promote student success.

We hope you can lead or contribute to the efforts on your campus to connect Kessler Scholars and other first-generation students with campus resources and opportunities to foster a greater sense of belonging and engagement. To support your planning and implementation of first-generation celebration day events and activities on your campus, we've created this document to offer resources, recommendations, and programming ideas for your review.

Recommendations:

- Consider institutional contexts to inform planning and implementation
- Align institutional narratives about first-generation students to recognize and affirm their strengths and many contributions to the institution and community
- Incorporate student voices throughout the planning process
- Identify and collaborate with colleagues across campus to host events and lead activities
