How does the external evaluation help you?

- **We collect data** from students, program staff, institutions and the Collaborative to help inform programming, and assess program success.
- We share back relevant insights with you to inform programming
 - Campus-specific reporting
 - Raw data (with consent) of student survey responses
 - Comparisons with the Collaborative, for context
- We provide **technical support** to help you make sense of the data and insights
 - Weekly office hours/ad-hoc 1-1 meetings
 - Regular email communication
 - Workshops/meetings like this

What is your role?

- Support data collection activities
 - Student Surveys/Focus Groups
 - Providing student rosters (names/email addresses/DOB)
 - Student outreach encourage sign-up for focus groups, pretesting, reminders for surveys
 - Program Participation Tracker
 - Complete a tracker that tells us what programs you organized, and how many students attended, etc
 - Staff Surveys/Interviews
 - Participate, share, give feedback!
 - Institutional data collection
 - Help liaise with IR offices to collect administrative and student-level data
- Most importantly, use the data and insights we provide to inform programming:)

Internal monitoring is also important

- External evaluation is limited in scope cannot get into the weeds of programming at all schools
- Important to track program effectiveness on your campus as well
 - Tracking student attendance at all programs
 - Collecting internal feedback on specific individual programs can use short google surveys or polls
 - Access student-level records internally if needed
- Use both internal and external data for any internal reporting requirements
